ALTERNATIVE LEARNING CENTRE NEWS

When deciding to enrol your student at KMG and you are aware they have a disability diagnosis , please assist the enrolment process by providing as much as possible relevant documentation and information. Disability documentation is for the purpose of providing an overview of the disability and information on the functional impact of the disability on a student so that effective accommodations can be identified.

The documentation needs to provide the school with a basic understanding of your child's disability and enough information to anticipate whether or not KMG would be a good fit for your child as an educational option.

To assist KMG to determine if enrolment is appropriate the following documentation would be appreciated:

- clearly state the diagnosed disability or disabilities
- describe the functional limitations resulting from the disability or disabilities
- be age-appropriate describing how the disability or disabilities currently affect the student in an educational setting
- describe the specific accommodations requested or required be typed or printed on official letterhead and be signed by a qualified medical practitioner to make the diagnosis

(include information about license or certification and area of specialisation).




