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## FROM OUR EXECUTIVE SCHOOL DIRECTOR

Welcome back to term 2, 2021!

Firstly, I want to acknowledge and thank our ancestors for the struggles they endured for country, belief systems, language and culture. Without them fighting for what they believed in and lighting the pathway for us to continue for our future generations we would have no 'Why'. We do what we do here because we are living the life that they could only dream of, so it is imperative that we continue to carve out future pathways for future generations to come so that they can all realise their potential and thrive.

I believe from speaking to our students we have created a safe meeting space where all who have joined us finally feel a sense of belonging where they can take down their barriers, fears and historic traumas and confidently walk together with us on their educational pathways.

Here at KMG we can support and nurture up to 60 students from years 7-12. We are in a prime central location as it works better for our students and families.

Our KMG family consists primarily of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, many of whom have not had positive experiences and or disengaged from mainstream institutions.

Here we believe that it is essential to feature Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture, especially our spiritual and cultural connection to our environment, namely the land and sea and our commitment to family, community, and maintaining our indigenous integrity. Our KMG Way provides multiple learning environments that uphold our school motto of Knowledge, Culture and Respect.

**The KMG way**: At KMG successes are routinely celebrated whether academic or social, large or small. The focus is on developing confident young people with a high sense of self-worth. Challenges are redirected as opportunities for learning and teaching, giving feedback and implementing alternative strategies. The desire to attend KMG grows from a sense of belonging to family; the KMG family, a sense of feeling safe and being supported no matter what the day throws at you. Each day is treated as a new day.

#### High expectations for academic success, tailored to the individual.

At KMG students are immersed in an educational program that reflects a student's individual learning journey. Units reflect the Australian Curriculum content and skills and incorporate the Aboriginal 8 ways of learning methodology. This embraces the cultural heart of the school. Teaching and Learning experiences are developed to include and emphasise the identity of our ATSI students and how their cultural knowledge and experiences enhance the classroom learning. Students celebrate passing subjects that they previously failed to succeed in. Life skills and our Alternate Learning Centre (ALC), together with a sense of identity and belonging, support and enhance these successful achievements.

#### **KMG** Parent Voice

"my children were disengaged from mainstream school and I wanted them to stay at school and have an education (because I didn't have one). If I had been offered a KMG school when I was a child – then I would have gone further with my education. It is a great opportunity. Look at my daughter – she's in Year 12 and doing great- I never thought she would get this far; she's ahead with her work and even through our personal struggles she is hitting her goals".

This week we have become familiar with various coding programs and have been investigating coding using an EV3 block.


We are also happy to welcome to the school, Mrs Sandra Bayliss from Mercy College Mackay, who is assisting us with robotic navigation and coding.

I'm here to ensure that you always have someone to talk to when you need to.


It's been a great start to term 2 and I have to say students are in high spirits. Let's continue to be Deadly, and work hard to achieve your educational goals.

This term students were able to start a new life skill program called strength. Students get an opportunity to work with a master craftsman. They will be making a wooden box from scratch. They will learn how to measure up, use hand tools and chisels to create an original piece to take home. In week 1 students had to learn the names of all of the tools they will be using at some point and do an inventory. They also got to choose their piece of wood too.
